
TX-KEA English Dyslexia Screener

Who is screened for dyslexia?

Universal Screening for reading and dyslexia is administered to all students in kindergarten as required by Texas Education Codes §28.006 and §38.003(a).

What literacy measures are part of the dyslexia screener?

TX-KEA is an approved reading instrument on CLI Engage that meets the requirements for dyslexia screening. The English screening TEA criteria that align to TX-KEA are as follows:



When must the dyslexia screener be completed by?

Kindergarten students must be screened by the end of the school year.


